



♦ INSTITUTE JOURNEY SO FAR →

All India Institutes of Medical Sciences, Patna was one of the six AIIMS which came into existence after the announcement made by our beloved Prime Minister Shri Atal Bihari Vajpayee in his idependence day speech from Red Fort, New Delhi on 15th August 2013. The foundation was laid by Shri Bhairon Singh Shekhawat, the then Vice President of India on 2nd January 2004 at Phulwarisharif. In August 2010, the union cabinet gave its nod for setting up of societies to run six AIIMS like institutions at the cost of 823 crores. Prof. Dr. Girish Kumar Singh was appointed as founder director on 1st November 2011. AIIMS Patna came into real existence as an Institute of National Importance (INI) by an Act of Parliament under the All India Institute of Medical Sciences (Amendment) Bill, 2012. The Act enabled AIIMS Patna to be an autonomous body on the lines of the existing AIIMS New Delhi. The institute became functional from 25th September 2012 after joining of its first undergraduate batch.

Ayush PMR Block was the first block where hospital services started along with two make shift operation theatres in which the first surgery, an orthopaedic procedure of left forearm bones of a young man was performed on 26th December 2013 by Founder Director, Dr G. K. Singh. The community outreach has always been an integral part of the institute and it made history by training 3200 people in first aid care at Siwan which was later recorded in Guiness Book of World Records. On 31st October, Prof Dr Gitanjali Batmanabane, Director AIIMS Bhubaneswar took over the additional and interim charge of Director AIIMS Patna after successful completion of tenure of Dr. Girish Kumar Singh as founder director.

Prof. Dr Prabhat Kumar Singh joined the institute as its next director on 27th February 2017. Under his visionary guidance, the institute became ready for the biggest leap of development to serve the last man in the queue. The hospital started taking its shape with new facilities like

OPD block, IPD - D & C blocks, 8 modular O.T.s, 9 bedded ICU, Trauma & Emergency services, central medical pipeline system for supply of medical gases, CSSD, Amrit Pharmacy became functional after formal inauguration by Hon'ble Minister of State & Family Welfare, Shri Ashwini Choubey and Bihar Health Minister, Shri Mangal Pandey.

Prof. N. K. Arora Director INCLEN was Nominated as the Hon'ble President of the institute in Oct. 2018.

The year 2018-19 was the year of advanced achievements for AIIMS Patna and all the hard works done in past started to show their colours. The Institute progressed in all the dimensions for which it was established. The journey of these achievements are enumerated as below:

Infrastructure & Patient care Services

In IPD, construction work of A & B blocks was completed and made ready for patient care. A state of art O.T. complex with 20 Integrated modular operation theatre became ready to be started, thus increasing the no. to 31 operation theatres.

Inspired by the commitment of our Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi of Digital India, **Hospital Information System (HIS)** software from **CDAC** was installed to make AIIMS Patna totally digital and paperless (Registration, Billing and Lab). His ambitious project of Health for all, Ayushman Bharat Yojna was successfully implemented, and till date, a total of 1029 patients have been treated with expenditure of approx. 2.4 crores.

An attempt was made to reduce the cost of treatment by establishing **Hospital Supply System (H.S.S.)** where in all items needed for patient care purchased from the manufacturers through rate contract at very low rates and supplied to the patient's bed side.

The Institute acquired a high energy linear

accelerator, Brachytherapy unit and CT simulator was commissioned for the cancer patients of the region as a State of Art Facility. This gave a real boost in the management of cancer patients. Further, AIIMS Patna was selected as Centre for imparting Certificate Courses in Palliative care by Indian Association of Palliative Care (IAPC). Pain services with OPD, IPD and O.T. facility was started for patients suffering from chronic pain and cancer patients.

Laboratory Services

Department of Radio diagnosis enhanced its capacity with installation of a Multidetector CT Scanner dedicated to cater Trauma & Emergency. A DR and DRF (Digital Radiography & Fluoroscopy) was commissioned in the department. Department of Pathology has started a full panel IHC markers by fully automated system. They have also started coagulation profile and advanced tests through, HPLC and Flow Cytometry. The total sample collection approx. 1,41,435 cases in a year. Round the clock functional Central Laboratory Services was started with routine and special tests. The total number of tests including special tests performed by the Lab this year is about 2,78,764. The Department of Microbiology has started new tests like Gene Expert (CBNAAT) and a total of 1767 suspected MTB samples were reported. The Integrated Counselling and Testing Center (ICTC) for HIV testing and counselling was established and a total of 5711 males and 4789 females attended the centre for HIV testing and counselling.

Research & Training

Our Director's initiative to bring Medical and Technical education together by bringing the specialists of the both fields and to nurture the innovative ideas, bring them into reality leading to establishment of a club called **AAVISHKAR CLUB.** In this regard a MoU was signed between AIIMS Patna and NIT Patna and Kalam Institute of Health Technology (KIHT). The Institute has also been chosen by ICMR to conduct research and strengthen health care services for Acute Encephalitis Syndrome (AES).

The postgraduate courses in various departments have started since January' 2019 and various Super speciality courses got nod from Standing Academic Committee to start from July' 2019 Batch.

From this year, the central library Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) got available on public IP and which can also be accessed through Android App to provide easy access to knowledge. A touch display workstation (SPECTRA TABLE) was installed in Anatomy Department to understand the normal human anatomy and also plan the surgery. A state of Art 3D Printer and scanner lab has been established to prepare models and plan for surgery.

In the coming year, we hope to recruit more faculty to strengthen the patient care. The starting of services like dialysis, Nuclear Medicine and Endocrinology will be over all priority.

Our institute expanded further with faculty strength reaching up to nearly 125 in 38 departments, many regular officers & staffs joining in, our academics & administrative strength also increased further.

Expansion of Hospital

All blocks A, B, C & D of Hospital is almost complete with more than 700 functioned Beds and nearly 100 ICU Beds of different specialities like ICU, MICU, Neurosurgical ICU, Critical Care ICU, Paediatric, Neonatoloy & Paediatric Surgery ICU, Pulmonary HDU, CCU, labour room etc. Like speciality departments our super speciality departments e.g. Haematology, Neonatology, Medical and Surgical Gastroenterology Paediatric Surgery, Urology, Cardiology, Cardio-Vascular Thoracic Surgery, Burns & Plastic Surgery, Pain & Palliative Care, Surgical Oncology, Endocrine Surgery, Trauma & Emergency, Neurosurgery etc. are also expanding further.

Last year there are footfalls of more than 5.69 lakhs OPD patients, 16,742 in-patient's admissions and an occupancy rate between 64-73 % and 7368 surgeries. With growing confidence of people in us, we strive hard to meet their expectations.

HIS, HSS, HRF

To keep pace with time, making registration and billing process simpler, and aim to make paperless institute, Hospitals Information System (HIS) is installed and working smoothly with the help of CDAC. Inventory, Pharmacy & Store management are also being done online itself. One can see bed status, lab results, operations and billing etc. on the system. Requisition for investigations of different labs can be raised from anywhere and reports can be obtained as soon it is prepared. This saves paper and time of medical & paramedical staff.

With my past experience of establishing HRF (Hospital Revolving Fund) at SGPGIMS, Lucknow, we have successfully launched HSS (Hospital Supply System) on the same principle (or guidelines), where all items needed for patient care like implants, consumables, drugs and disposables are purchased from OEM (Manufacturer) at very low cost. Rate contracts have been done for most of the items.

We are treating patients under **Ayushmaan Bharat Yojna** and more than 1000 patients got benefited this year with an estimated expenditure of approx. 2.4 crores. We are also getting aids from CM Relief fund for major surgeries, chemotherapy & intensive care patients.

E-tendering is started and procurement process are done online with E-tenders & GEM (Government's E-Marketing).

Newer expansion for clinical services

- A new SOP has been prepared for 24 Hrs. trauma and emergency services in Trauma building that facilitate quick care of patients coming to emergency.
- 20 state of art integrated modular OT's are ready on 5th & 6th floor of A Block. Thus we will have 31 OT's in the institute in coming year.
- Modern Cath-Lab is installed with adjacent CCU. Soon Angioplasty with other procedures will start.
- **Endoscopy suite:** facility for endoscopy procedures with ERCP in GE dept. is in place.
- **Haemodialysis:** Haemodialysis unit on PPP mode started for admitted patients.
- **Radiology:** New machines installed CT Scan in Trauma and RFA, particularly beneficial for Radio-frequency ablation of Tumours.

- Linear accelerator for Radiotherapy is working.
- Biochemistry, Pathology, Microbiology labs are running round the clock. OPD patients can give samples up to 4 PM. Histopathology with immunohistochemistry, CBNAAT etc. facility is also added this year. Altogether more than 42 lakhs samples were collected.
- Transfusion medicine has its functional operation of advance facilities of component separation & Plasmapheresis.
- In basement of hospital building new CSSD Complex (of Getinge), Pharmacy and Central store have been working from its designated areas. Drugs and consumables are being supplied to the patients on their beds.
- Work of Medical gas pipeline system with manifold is complete for the entire hospital. Hospital kitchen, services for differently abled and security services are further expanded.

Teaching and Research

Three batches of MBBS & B.Sc. (Nursing) have already passed out from the institute. Many of our students have done well in Post graduate/entrance examination both at national and international level. Students have bagged many prizes in academics, sports, literally, cultural and quiz events organised at national level by various medical institutes & professional associations. We encourage them to participate in co-curricular activities organised in the institute like KAIZEN, Aavishkar Club, ZAGON etc. and lectures by eminent persons of different fields.

With the initiation of process of recruitment of more faculty we will start about 100 seats for MD, MS, DM and M.Ch. courses, already approved by Standing Academic Committee. This year we got MD, MS candidate in all subjects and M.Ch. candidate in Paediatric surgery. Post-Doctoral certificate courses (POCC) are also approved for many sub specialities of major subjects.

About 19 research projects are completed in the institute and 209 another projects are going on, out of which 32 are supported by extramural funding. More than 200 publications in journals

this years.

We encourage Research within teaching & clinical practice –

Community Outreach

This was a year full of activities for Community Outreach. AIIMS Patna runs several community outreach programmes and Telemedicine department helps us to reach the remotest areas of the state. We have organised 34 medical awareness camps in urban & semi urban areas of the state, Participated in Swashthya mela etc. we have developed a module for QMRT (Quick Medical Response Team) training program for first responders for Bihar Government's medical, paramedical & police officers team. We have organised 22 CPR camps and also run a certificate training course for CPR and 'Shrawan kumar Yojna' to train health volunteers to serve ailing elderly. We work in association with Bihar State Disaster Management Authority (BSDMA) and Govt. of Bihar for its various training programme, multi hazard risk assessment, SOP for Mass Causality and Emergency Coordination Committee (ECC), Epidemiology Survey & participate for various national health programmes.

Blood Bank regularly organised voluntary blood donation camps with help of other educational institutes and NGOs.

Future Vision & Plans

We are moving towards building our dream hospital maintaining high standards with support of all involved, gaining patient trust & ample scope of new developments.

- Skill Labs

Creating the resource and expanding our services to meet the health care needs for people of this part of country and to continue research & finding the ways towards reducing the existing disparity in providing medical facilities and bringing it at par with the global standard shall continue to be my priority and vision for the coming years.

- > Telemedicine facility provided free medical consultation to about 6000 patients at their home thus, connecting AIIMS Patna to the far away rural populations.





← HOSPITAL INFECTION CONTROL COMMITTEE (HICC) →

The Hospital Infection Control Committee (HICC) is an advisory to Medical Superintendent (MS) and makes its recommendations. Itmeets periodically to discuss day to day activities, identifies and solves problems related to hospital infection control at AIIMS, Patna.

Structure of HICC:

The HICC functions under the chairmanship of the Medical Superintendent of AIIMS, patna. The member secretary and infection control officer (ICO) are faculties of dept of Microbiology. Other members include deputy Medical Superintendent, Nursing Superintendent, faculty from medical as well as surgical specialities, faculty from dept of Community and Family medicine, Infection control Nurses (ICN), representatives from CSSD, Blood bank, ICUs, Central store, Central Pharmacy, Procurement cell, Sanitation department, Kitchen, Biomedical engineer and Nursing officer Incharge of ICU.

Activities

The HICC team supervises the infection control program at AIIMS, Patna with laboratory support from central lab(Microbiology). The following activities were performed in 2018-19.

1. Environmental Surveillance:

a. MICROBIOLOGICAL SURVEILLANCE OF OTS AND ICUS

Environmental surveillance including air and surface were carried out in areas of need, such as intensive care units, operation theatres and other critical areas. The reports were dispatched to the concerned department. A total of 802 surface samples and 212 air samples were tested.

b. WATER SURVEILLANCE

From different areas of AIIMS, Patna samples were tested and water qualities were reported

as feedback. A total of 04 water samples were tested.

2. Testing of Biological indicators

A total of 192 vials of Biological indicators were tested to validate steam sterilization cycles of autoclaves from CSSD.

3. Blood bag sterility checking:

A total of 12 samples received from blood bank were tested as a part of sterility checking of different blood components as well as unused bags.

4. Staff Health Care Activities

The most effective method of preventing occupationally acquired infections is adopting safe working practices. Immunization is not a substitute for good working practices. Therefore, employee health & safety educations were carried out as appropriate.

a. NEEDLE STICK INJURY

Needlestick injuries are a common occupational hazard in the hospital setting. A quick and appropriate response to a needle stick injury can greatly decrease the risk of disease transmission following an occupational exposure to potentially infectious materials. After a needle stick injury, an affected health care worker should wash the area with soap and water immediately and report to ICN.A needlestick proforma is used to record and report events. Rapid testing for the exposed staff and exposure source is advocated free of cost and further management is advised. A total of 61 needle stick events were reported.

b. HEPATITIS B VACCINATION PROGRAM:

HICC had organized Hepatitis B vaccination for healthcare staff and a total of 490 doses were

administered in different phases between 13.06.2018 and 30.10,2018.

5. Outbreak Management

The HICC initiates outbreak investigation by first collecting the up to date information, which is communicated to the authorities. Strict vigilance of nursing and medical health workers is ensured. Immediate control measures are undertaken. Appropriate recommendations are implemented. An outbreak of varicella occurred among health care workers at Neonatal Surgical ICU, Paediatric surgery ward, CTVS ward and Paediatrics ward was investigated & successfully managed.

6. Education and Training

Education is a key component of HICC. The hands of health care workers are the most common cause of transmission of microorganisms between patients and frequently implicated as the route of transmission during outbreak of infection. Hence, there has been a clear focus on Hand Hygiene education and awareness throughout the hospital.

- a. Periodic classes for the house keeping staffs, hospital attendants, Nursing officers, Technicians, Biomedical waste handlers, Food handlers covering standard precautions, asepsis, disinfection policies, spill managementwere carried out by ICNs throughoutthe year.
- b. Special awareness classeson H1N1 which included epidemiology, clinical features,

management and measures for prevention of transmission of H1N1 were conducted by Hospital Infection Control Committee (HICC) AIIMS, Patna. Around 611 nursing officers (Regular, contract and outsourcing) and 26 CRPF personnelwere educated in these classes. The classes were conducted on 23rd, 25th February 2019, and also from 1st March to 9th March and 11th March 2019.

- c. Antimicrobial stewardship quiz was organized on world antibiotic day among Senior residents, Junior residents and Interns. The winning team participated in the national level quiz held at AIIMS, Rishikesh.
- d. A World water day program was conducted by Hospital Infection control committee (HICC), AIIMS Patna on 22nd March 2019 in front of OPD from 11.30 am -12.15 pm. Various activities such as recitation of poem, slogan and posters were prepared on water conservation by fourth year B.Sc. (Hons) Nursing students. They also performed mime on water conservation.
- **7.**The ICNs took active participation in conducting "Kayakalp" round 2019
- **8.** The member secretary was nominated to conduct peer review for "Kayakalp" related activities at AIIMS, Jodhpur.

Objectives of IEC

The objective of Institutional ethics committee (IEC) of All India Institute of Medical Sciences, Patna is to maintain effective functioning and to ensure quality and technical excellence and consistent ethical review of all the submitted health and biomedical research proposals and ongoing approved research studies involving human participants in accordance with the ICMR ethical guidelines for biomedical research on human subjects.

Role and Responsibilities:

The AIIMS-P-IEC reviews all types of research proposals involving human participants with a view to safeguard the dignity, rights, safety and wellbeing of all actual and potential research participants before approving the research proposals. The goals of research, however important, should never be permitted to override the health and wellbeing of the human participants.

The mandate of the IEC shall be to review all research projects to be conducted at the Institution involving human beings directly or indirectly, irrespective of whether the research project is funded or non-funded, and if funded, then irrespective of the funding agency.

Administration and Management

A full time secretariat and space for keeping records is required for a well-functioning IEC. The members could be given a reasonable compensation for the time spared for reviewing the proposals. Reasonable fees can be charged to cover the expenses related to review and administrative processes for any third party (protocols submitted by researchers not employed by AIIMS-Patna).

Frequency of Meeting:

The meeting of the IEC was held on periodic intervals, i.e. last Friday of May, July, September, November, December, January, February and March unless otherwise specified by the member secretary. Additional review meetings can also be held with short notice as and when required. Meetings are planned in accordance to the need of the work load.

The office of Chief Vigilance Officer (CVO) was created on 4th March 2016 vide order No.847/AllMS/Pat/Dir./ 2016 to check the activities leading to corruption. The role and functions of CVO is broadly divided in to two components.

1. The preventive side:

- (a) To examine in detail the existing rules and procedures of the organisation with a view to eliminate or minimise the scope for corruption or malpractices.
- (b) To identify the sensitive/corruption prone spots in the organisation and keep an eye on personnel posted in such areas.
- (C) To plan and enforce surprise inspections and regular inspections to detect system failures and existence of corruption or malpractices.
- (d) To maintain proper surveillance on officers of doubtful integrity.
- (e) To ensure prompt observance of Conduct Rules relating to integrity of the officers, like
 - (i) The Annual Property Returns.
 - (ii) Gifts accepted by the officials.
 - (iii) Benami transactions.
 - (iv) Regarding relatives employed in private firms or doing private business etc.

2. The punitive side:

- (i) To ensure speedy processing of vigilance cases at all stages. In regard to cases requiring consultation with the Central Vigilance Commission, a decision as to whether the case has a vigilance angle shall in every case be taken by the CVO who, when in doubt, may refer the matter to his administrative head, i.e. Secretary in the case of Ministries/ Departments and Chief Executive in the case of public sector organisations.
- (ii) To ensure that charge-sheet, statement of imputations, lists of witness and documents etc. are carefully prepared and copies of all the documents relied upon and the statements of witnesses cited on behalf of the disciplinary authority are supplied wherever possible to the

- accused officer along with the charge-sheet.
- (iii) To ensure that all documents required to be forwarded to the enquiring Officer are carefully sorted out and sent promptly.
- (iv) To ensure that there is no delay in the appointment of the enquiring Officer, and that no dilatory tactics are adopted by the accused officer or the Presenting Officer.
- (v) To ensure that the processing of the enquiry Officer's Reports for final orders of the Disciplinary Authority is done properly and quickly.
- (vi)To scrutinise final orders passed by the Disciplinary Authorities subordinate to the Ministry/Department, with a view to see whether a case for review is made out or not.
- (vii)To see that proper assistance is given to the C.B.I. in the investigation of cases entrusted to them or started by them on their own source of information.
- (viii) To take proper and adequate action with regard to writ petitions filed by accused officers.
- (ix) To ensure that the Central Vigilance Commission is consulted at all stages where it is to be consulted and that as far as possible, the time limits prescribed in the Vigilance Manual for various stages are adhered to.
- (x) To ensure prompt submission of returns to the Commission.
- (xi) To review from time to time the existing arrangements for vigilance work in the Ministry/Department for vigilance work subordinate officers to see if they are adequate to ensure expeditious and effective disposal of vigilance work.
- (xii) To ensure that the competent disciplinary authorities do not adopt a dilatory or law attitude in processing vigilance cases, thus knowingly otherwise helping the subject public servants, particularly in cases of officers due to retire.
- (xiii) To ensure that cases against the public servants on the verge of retirement do not lapse due to time-limit for reasons such as misplacement of files etc. and that the orders passed in the cases of

retiring officers are implemented in time.

- (xiv) To ensure that the period from the date of serving a charge-sheet in a disciplinary case to the submission of the report of the Inquiry Officer, should, ordinarily, not exceed six months.
- Vigilance week was observed from 29th October 2018 to 3rd November 2018. During this week
- public awareness was conducted through posters. All faculty, Staff and Students took integrity pledge.
- Dr. Ramji Singh, CVO was nominated and participated in three days induction training course for part time CVOs at ISTM from 10th September to 12th September 2018.

Hospitals are healthcare institutions providing patient treatment and care with specialized medical and nursing staff. They also play an important role in acquiring knowledge about various aspects of human life. These institutions are site of spreading awareness about various diseases, healthy lifestyle which is essential to improve the quality of life in the society. Hospitals also generate huge amount of revenue which can be used for the betterment of healthcare services.

AIIMS, Patna serves patients belonging to Bihar and other neighbouring states. It is involved in clinical services as well as teaching of medical and nursing students, Paramedical Staff of hospital and the community. It has outpatient facilities running in the new OPD building. IPD facilities and OTs are presently functional in Ayush/PMR Block, B Block, C Block and Trauma/Emergency. Radiology tests like X-Ray, Ultrasound, CT Scan, DSA and MRI facilities are also being provided. The central laboratory is also fully functional and Pathology, Microbiological, and Bio-Chemistry test facilities are being provided. Blood bank and Trauma/Emergency services also available. Two ambulances (24x7) are also available for transport of patient. Central Pharmacy is functional in the institute for the IPD patients/EHS beneficiary. Hospital Information System (HIS) and Hospital Infection Control are also functional in the Institute. Ayushman Bharat Yojna (PMJAY) facility is also available for the patients.

Employee Health Scheme (EHS) facility is likely to be started soon for the employees of AIIMS, Patna. With all these developments, it is also expected that by the end of the year approximately 900 inpatient beds, 20 more OTs will be made functional.

The training and awareness program has been conducted regularly for skill development of hospital staffs like nursing officers, hospital attendants housekeepers, security staff etc.

Professional upgradation of Nursing Personnels:

Nursing services at AIIMS focus on improving the nursing care by facilitating abundant opportunities for higher studies. Nine nurses have obtained P.B.B.Sc nursing qualification and one nursing officer has successfully completed the M. Phil in nursing education.

Activities organized by the nursing officers:

- Other than the patient care the nursing officers are actively participating in the ward teaching of UG nursing students.
- Nursing personnels are actively participating in health camps, out reaching programmes like community health camps, blood donation camps.
- Nursing personnels are observing the nurses day every year and organizing plantation drive, blood donation and other kind of activities

Infection control nurses activities:

- HICC core committee meets periodically to discuss day to day activities and interventions. HICC
 administrative rounds conducted periodically with infection control core committee, identified
 problems discussed and rectified.
- There are three ICN who are exclusively placed for implementing the infection control policies and regularly monitoring and assuring the infection control practices among the nurses.
- Regular ward teaching on infection control measures been taught to students, patients and attendant's.
- Surveillance activities: Surveillance of environmental culture and sterility samples taken monthly basis and reports recorded and distributed to all respective areas and discussed to reinforce proper protocols.

4. PHARMACY:

Introduction:


The department of pharmacy is one of the major ancillary departments in AIIMS, Patna. The department procures drugs (Tablets, Injections, IV fluids, Surgical dressings, Disinfectants, and Chemicals etc.) through Rate Contract and Local Purchase, stores the drugs as per the guidelines, distributes to the various IPD Pharmacy Stores. In the beginning, pharmacy started to provide its services with only one pharmacy store. But, today, its services are expanded to more than 6 units including IPD pharmacy, EHS Pharmacy, OT Pharmacy and Trauma Pharmacy. Pharmacy makes available essential medicines at reasonable cost and minimizes the expiry and wastage of drugs.

Vision

In line with the vision of AIIMS, Patna the vision of the department of pharmacy is to provide continuous supply of quality and cost effective pharmaceuticals, efficient utilization pharmaceuticals by minimizing wastage and providing pharmaceutical care endowed with updated evidence-based patient counselling, monitoring drug usage and evaluation.

5. REGISTRATION/BILLING (HOSPITAL SUPPORT CARDE)

Registration and billing counters are the first contact points where welcoming of patients and their registration is carried out. Almost 2500 patients are registered and treated due to their diligence and responsibilities towards their duties. The department carris out the admission of patients, there are discharge, cash refund services along with cash and billing details.

6. SANITATION SERVICES

Sanitation services established since the functioning of AIIMS, Patna. It provides a clean environment to the student, staff, patients and their attendants.

Objectives

The department of sanitation is dedicated to provide clean and infection free environment in the AIIMS Patna premises. The department also provides Pest control services at AIIMS, Patna and actively liaisons with the different agencies like Municipal Corporation, Bihar State Pollution Control Board, and NGO etc.

Presently the department is comprised a team of 5 Sanitary Inspectors and outsources 5 Sanitary Supervisor & Housekeeper. Mechanized cleaning is done by jet pressure Floor Scrubber machine, Vacuum cleaner etc. The activities conducted by sanitation Dept. are:

- Management of Bio medical Waste according to the norms and submitted yearly report.
- Infection Control & Hand hygiene practices
- Time to time training of housekeeping staffs
- Conducting vector control measures.
- Sanitation Awareness through Nukkad Natak, Painting competition and other activities.
- Maintain / Proper cleanliness as per guidelines of Kayakalp/HICC.
- Maintain checklist of different cleaning areas of the hospital.

7. DIETETICS SERVICES

Department of Dietetics takes care of the therapeutic dietary needs of approximate 500 indoor patients every day, Various kinds of diet are catered to the patients based on nutritional screening and nutritional assessment done by the dieticians in their respective wards. ├ TELEMEDICINE AND COMMUNITY OUTREACH SERVICES — **├**

Telemedicine unit of AIIMS Patna has been working since December 2012 under the Community Outreach Services. The aim of this service is to provide healthcare facility to the last men in the queue. We have opened 60 new Telemedicine Centres in various district of Bihar such as Siwan, Saran, Buxar, Sitamarhi, Muzaffarpur. etc. The unit is also providing the health care facility in the form health camps not only in the Bihar but also outside this state like Nepal.

Spectrum of Activities

Telemedicine provides the free medical consultation to people at their home (between 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM) with the help of SKY-PE and Evolko electronic medical record system from Ayush Building (Monday to Saturday). More than 30,000 people of the community got free medical consultation by this facility. About sixty (60) TMO (Telemedicine operator) from various remote areas of Bihar are connected with Telemedicine Unit of AIIMS Patna to get free medical consultation.

Community services:

The unit has conducted 16 free health camp & awareness programme at various remote areas of Bihar. Swakshta Swasthya Antyoday Abhiyan organised at Gandhi Maidan under the activity of Swakshta pakhwada.

Teaching & Training:

Established the Sharwan Kumar Yojna (SKY Course) to give education about how to give care for the elderly people of our society. Our 10

Sharwan Kumar has been adopted by community people for Geriatric Care.

Telemedicine Unit also co-ordinated a 120 days extensive training programme to teach different clinical skills to the participants who attended the training programme of SKY. Established the CT (Chhatisa & Telemedicine) course to train the common people and school going children about Pre- Hospital care for Trauma Victim. Trained more than 200 students of AB Niketan School, Patna regarding Pre- Hospital Care and CPR. The members have actively participated in Swakshtha Swasthy Antyodaya Abhiyan at Patna in which Awareness regarding Swakshtha was given to more than 10000 people of Community.

There are some research projects also going on in the department viz. evaluation of Health care in Siwan District, role of water with high iron content in Constipation in North Bihar, skin infections in flood affected zone of Bihar, impact of Pre-Hospital Care in trauma patients, impact of Sharwan Kumar Yojna Training Programme on the improvement in quality of life of geriatric age people, incidence of Juvenile hypertension in School going children, incidence and health awareness about refractory error in auto driver of Patna.

We also organised such training in our Institute for the common people to train about first aid for trauma victims in their community. Our Department trained more than 300 doctors and paramedical staff at Kumbh Mela who were supposed to be posted in mela for 3 months. We are running the **CT Course** to train the common people and school going children about Pre-Hospital care for Trauma Victim. Our Faculty are also conducting the QMRT course Training programme.

Physiotherapy services are offered to all clinical departments at AIIMS Patna. including Orthopedics, P.M.& R., Neurology, Neurosurgery, Radiotherapy, Onco surgery, Pediatrics, Pediatric surgery, Obstetrics and Gynecology, General Medicine, General Surgery & Pulmonary Medicine, Plastic Surgery, Gastro Surgery, Trauma ICU,NICU PICU HDU, Emergency etc. All members strive to identify all the underlying causes of patient problems and by targeting these with a combination of up-to-date treatment techniques, lifestyle management and the latest rehabilitation protocols, try to not only relieve their pain but help prevent it from coming back.

Spectrum of activities

On an average, a single patient require about 20-40 minutes of treatment using different modalities and around 2500 patients per month in OPD and approx 300 patients per month in IPD are being treated.

Physiotherapy Services currently offered by the department are Therapeutic exercises, Short wave diathermy, Interferential therapy, Laser therapy, Lumber and cervical traction, Ultrasonic therapy, Electrical nerve stimulation, Lower Limb CPM, Upper limb CPM, Cryotherapy, T.E.N.S., Manual Therapy, Antenatal & Postnatal care, Treadmill training, Quadriceps chair exerciser.

Infrastructure

The equipments available in the department are TENS (4 channel), Interferential therapy, Electrical muscle stimulator, CPM (Lower Limb), CPM (Upper limb), Traction unit (cervical & lumbar), Laser therapy, SWD (500 watt),

Cryotherapy, Tilt table, Postural Drainage table, Mechanical Vibrator, Parallel bar and mirror, Shoulder wheel, Wall bar, Ankle foot exerciser, Thera band, Physio ball, Wobble Board, Sphygmomanometer, Stethoscope, Weighing machine, Goniometer, Knee hammer, Shoulder strength exercise, Hand grip exercise, Incentive Spirometer, Weight cuffs dumbbells, Walker, Axillary crutch, Vibro machine, Rubber Dumbbells Set (1-10 kg), Dumbbells Rack, Leg press and calf raise, Medicine Ball (0-10 kg), Yoga mat, Commercial Upright Bike, Dual Leg Curl & Leg Extension, Double twister, Commercial Motorized Treadmill.

The vision of the Physiotherapy Unit - "Pain free India" is to be recognized as an outstanding Physiotherapy service center providing state of art patient care by means of advanced electrotherapeutic modalities and evidence based therapeutic exercises to improve quality of patient care in the region, state and nation. The Physiotherapy services envision to develop it as training centre in the region for upcoming Physiotherapist and impart the knowledge of patient's care.

Every medical specialty requires the support of physiotherapy services for early rehabilitation and recovery. The department dreams of evolving and improving to become the best in the field and to achieve this goal, newer physiotherapy techniques like KINESIO TAPING, Dry needling, Cupping therapy with latest equipments are being planned.

There is a SOP for allotment of rooms prioritywise. We have a dedicated staff who works to reflect our culture of conviviality.



DEPARTMENT OF ANAESTHESIOLOGY



Anaesthesiology department is the backbone of all surgical specialities as they provide perioperative care to the patients that are being operated upon. Other than routine surgeries, many complicated surgeries of gastro surgery, onco-surgery, uro-surgery, and neurosurgery were performed with good outcome due to this perioperative care.

Initiation of Post Graduate Course of MD Anaesthesiology this year is a milestone for the department. Total ten Postgraduate admissions per year are allowed by the Institute Body. AIIMS Patna was selected as a centre for imparting Certificate course in Palliative Care by Indian Association of Palliative care (IAPC). It started in November 2018 and the first batch of 30 healthcare professionals was trained.

The department also runs acute pain services (APS) to the surgical patients. Palliative care was strengthened with indoor and end of life care. Day care surgeries of Ophthalmology, General Surgeries are being done on routine basis. Anaesthesia is being provided at remote locations including MRI, CT-Scan suits and services in Brachytherapy, Gastroenterology (ERCP) and Psychiatry department (ECT).

The department is involved in clinical research and papers are published and presented in scientific conferences. One of the faculties got the first prize in the International Scientific forum.

DEPARTMENT OF ANATOMY



Majority of the activities of the department are centred around teaching and research. The Department of Anatomy was established to undertake MBBS, B.Sc. Nursing (Hons.) undergraduate, postgraduates, doctoral education and training. The undergraduate course run by our distinguished faculty and residents helps the students with a solid foundation in the medical sciences. The department is committed to provide embalming services for dead bodies and running the body donation programme. The department receives "Will Forms" from the public for donation of the whole body after death. The department is also an active collaborator for various cadaveric workshops for post-graduate training and skills training in surgical and allied disciplines. The faculty has been engaged in research and have noteworthy research publications in peerreviewed journals. They have also served as members of editorial boards of several national and international journals. Departmental research is diverse and addresses problems in gross anatomy, histology, developmental biology, neurobiology and genetics.

Spectrum of Activities

Teaching and learning methodology of the department include both conventional and modern approaches. It contains academic lecture classes as well as Acland's videos, animations and interactive virtual dissection modules, demonstrations, practical classes; problembased learning, objectively structured practical examination, students seminars, quiz competitions. For the department, residents and faculty members continued teaching/ learning process is running. It includes various activities such as journal club presentations by residents

and faculty members. The department also collaborated the teaching and dissection of the temporal bone with the ENT department for the training of Senior residents. The department also participated actively in the weekly academic event of the institute, i.e. clinical grand round (CGR). Our department also provided short term summer training in histological techniques. The services going to start in the future are: bone preparation lab, immune histology, molecular genetics and stereology.

Research activity

Body donation Programme: About eight volunteers got registered for whole body donation in the department.

Embalming Services: for educational purpose Model making: Developing scientifically correct models- 2D (relief work) and 3DModels, charts of our own and other departments with the help of Artists. Addition of about 20 new models to the previous list in Embryology, for teaching purpose. Acquisition of about 20 new gross museum specimen.

DEPARTMENT OF BIOCHEMISTRY



Introduction:

Since the starting of AIIMS Patna in the year 2012, the Department of Biochemistry exists in its own growth phase. After promoting the infrastructure of undergraduate medical education for MBBS and Nursing courses, the department has now started MD course in Biochemistry and is heading for implementation of PhD programme besides having its existing research training programme for summer students and fellows under sponsored extramural research projects. Among its other academic endeavours, the department of biochemistry admires the participation of its Faculty members in National and International Conferences through presentation of their research work conducted in AIIMS Patna by the support of extramural funds sponsored by various National agencies of the Govt. of India. The department has also been successful in publishing research papers and scientific reviews on health and diseases in high impact journals of national and international repute. The faculty members of the department are also enlisted as editorial board members, experts of review committees and examiners of academic institutions in national and international level. The department has set its clinical test laboratory as the central facility of the hospital through addition of more routine and special tests for patients from wards to ambulatory units to provide hassle free patients care service. The department has also set up tumour marker test facility to serve cancer patient's diagnosis and treatment.

Spectrum of Activities:

- Central Biochemistry Laboratory Service: 24h x 7days, with routine and special test detection, tumour marker test facility and low cost benefit speciality unit for BPL patients. Various tests of 117 different types are presently running on regular basis in the central clinical laboratory facility. The laboratory shares its updates routinely with all concerned consultants and departments. The gross total number of tests including special tests performed during April 2018 to March 2019 is 2, 78,764 (Two lakhs seventy eight thousand seven hundred sixty four).
- Extramurally funded research activities, Participation and presentation in national and international scientific meetings, upholding of Journal Club and Quiz tutorials to update advancement of clinical science and medicine world.
- The department participates in the community service programme for free health check-ups organized by AIIMS, Patna.

Teaching & Training

Routine teaching of MBBS and Nursing students, Summer training of biochemical research and biotechnology.

The Department of Burns & Plastic surgery has always been devoted for providing exemplary patient care and aims to be one of the best departments in providing tertiary care to all its needy patients. The department is fully equipped for performing Advanced microsurgery, Comprehensive hand surgery, Maxillofacial surgery, Post burn reconstructive surgery, Reconstructive trauma surgery, Reconstructive oncosurgery, Congenital reconstructive surgeries, aesthetic surgery and advanced wound managements.

The department currently has 1 associate professor and 2 assistant professors. The present faculties are supported by 2 Senior residents, 4 Junior residents, 1 Staff nurse, 1 Lower division Clerk, 1 OT technician and 3 Hospital attendants.

Some of the highlights for the year 2018-19 include:

- The department organized Mid Term CME of National Academy of Burns – India (NABI) on 14-15th July 2018 at AIIMS Patna. It was a national level CME which included 23 lectures by 12 national Faculty and attended by Plastic Surgeons, general surgeons, medical and nursing students.
- The department got a grant of 12.5 crores after signing of the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between AIIMS Patna and NTPC Limited (dated 26.09.2018) for setting up a state of art 'Burns Center' within the Institute Premises.
- Conduction of Workshop on "Hair Transplantation" on 10th October 2018 with live demonstration of various techniques of hair transplantation.
- Initiation of reconstructive surgeries for brachial plexus injuries in the department including nerve repair/transfer, tendon/muscletransferetc.
- Initiation of 30-bedded dedicated Plastic surgery inpatient ward, 5th floor, IPD block
- Operation theatre was increased from 1 day/week to 5 days/week. At present,

- department has 1 dedicated O.T. which runs from Monday to Friday in a week.
- The department got the approval of MCh seats by SAC to be started from January 2020 session.
- Faculty members participated as Resource persons for conduction of workshop on "Hands on suturing & knotting" for Intern batch and on "Tendon & Nerve Injuries" for Post graduate trainees from all over Bihar, organised at AIIMS Patna.
- Faculty members participated as Resource persons for Plastic Surgery Team in surgical camps organized by Lifeline Express at Araria, Arrah, Purnea (districts of Bihar) under Community Outreach Program of the Institute.
- Conduction of CPR Training at various schools and colleges of Patna during National Road Safety Week (4-10th February 2019) in collaboration with State Transport Dept. and Disaster Management Dept. Govt. of Bihar.
- Participation of the department in various health camps organized in the rural areas of Bihar under Community Outreach programme of the Institute.
- Faculty members prepared Guidelines for Road Safety in Bihar, Curriculum for District Level Road Safety Awareness Programme, Module on Prevention and Management of Health Hazard Issues in Bihar as Member, Drafting Committee in collaboration with the Dept. of Disaster Management, Govt. of Bihar.

The biggest landmark for the department in the past years has been the approval of the project for establishing Burn Centre at AIIMS Patna by NTPC India and being granted a total of 12.55 crores for the same. MoU was signed on 26th September 2018. The Burn centre will be a state of art facility for the burn patients with 50 bedded wards, 15 ICU beds, 2 modular operation theaters, hydrotherapy unit, dressing rooms, Burn OPD and Skin Bank.

Spectrum of activities:

Clinical

- The department is providing Outpatient care from Monday to Saturday dealing in all the aspects of plastic surgery. It has catered to around 8000 patients in the previous years. The department also has an independent 30 bedded plastic surgery inpatient ward with dedicated staff for the care of the admitted patients.
- Surgeries are done daily from Monday to Friday in the newly opened OT complex with 1 OT dedicated to Burns & plastic surgery. Apart from providing elective surgeries, emergency surgeries are also performed in the trauma OT complex. A variety of specialized surgical procedures are performed for management of Brachial plexus injuries, various Congenital deformities and malformations, Oncoplastic reconstructions, Microvascular and microneurological surgeries, Traumatic reconstructions, Hand surgeries, Burn reconstructions and Maxillofacial trauma. Over 500 surgeries have been performed in the pastyear.

Non-clinical

The department's faculty members actively participated as the organizing team in the institute extracurricular activities like Institute foundation day. The faculty also held an important role as members of various committee of student activities which includes annual sports, KAIZEN, SPANDAN etc.

Community services/Outreach programs

The faculties as well as residents have actively participated in several community services and outreach programs organized under the banner of the institute. The department also supported operative camps as resource faculty for cleft lip surgeries in Lifeline express at Araria, Ara and Purnea districts of Bihar. Free health camp for auto drivers was also organized during the National Road safety week involving the Institute

team.

Teaching and training

The department is proactively involved in teaching and training activities of undergraduate, postgraduate as well as nursing students including lectures, clinical postings and departmental teachings. The Faculty members are also enlisted as editorial board members, experts of review committees in reputed national and international journals. All the members actively participated in training of medical and police personnels which were organized by institute in collaboration with Dept. of Disaster Management, Govt. of Bihar educating about disaster management.

Infrastructure:

- General OPD services on all six weekdays from Monday to Saturday
- Specialized clinics of keloid, vascular malformation, hand clinic and cleft clinics in the second half on a weekly basis.
- The department has an independent OT which functions 5 days a week.
- Inpatient department has 30 beds dedicated to the department of Burns & Plastic Surgery.

Future planning

The future aim of the department is to establish the state of the art Tertiary Burn centre at AIIMS which could benefit the hugely deprived population of Bihar. The department also plans to start LASER treatments in plastic surgery (equipment is already in the process of procurement) and treatment of complex craniofacial deformities. In the training domain the process for establishing a microsurgical lab for developing microsurgical skills of residents and trainees is already in the process.

The Department of Community and Family Medicine, a clinical science department in the AIIMS Patna, has an enthusiastic and dynamic environment where faculty, staff, and students are engaged in learning, scholarship, collaboration and are committed to improve the health of Bihar. The Centre aims to produce high-quality public health professionals and community physicians.

The Department of Community & Family Medicine has the speciality which deals with populations and comprises of those doctors who try to measure the needs of the people, both sick and well, who plan and administer services to meet those needs, and those who are engaged in research and teaching in the field.

The goal of the Department is to stretch the boundaries of educational innovation, provide exceptional care to individuals and families by addressing physical, psychological and social problems; and coordinate comprehensive health care services with other specialists as needed and apply knowledge of behavioural and social sciences in the patient management plan, respecting the autonomy, dignity and rights of the patient/family.

The Department also offers educational and research opportunities for individuals pursuing careers in the patient-care professions, public health and the biomedical sciences, advancing knowledge through epidemiological, biostatistical, behavioural and socio-clinical, ethical and legal research.

The Department is consistently working towards the discovery of new knowledge in the domain of public health and advocacy for application of new ideas in health care of populations. The department is actively involved in providing its expertise both at the national as well as at the

state health programs and policy through active participation.

Spectrum of activities

The Community Medicine OPD at AIIMS, Patna offers an array of health interventions including preventive, promotive, diagnostic and counselling services for all clients. It caters to a variety of patients not only from AIIMS hospital but also those who self-report for utilization of these facilities. This is the only centre for Yellow Fever & Oral Polio Vaccination Centre in Bihar for international travellers approved by Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Govt. of India. It started its journey on 21st July 2016. Since then, vaccination is provided on every Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday throughout the year. During 2018-2019, 2784 and 944 persons were vaccinated against yellow fever and polio respectively.

The Integrated Counselling and Testing Centre for HIV testing and counselling was inaugurated on 28th June 2018 at CFM OPD, and the services began from 1st July 2018 at a rapid pace. People are counselled and tested for HIV either of their own free will (client-initiated) or as advised by a medical provider (provider-initiated). All the clients are initially offered pre-test counselling/ information by expert counsellors followed by the HIV testing. Depending on the HIV test results, these clients also receive post-test counselling, and the positive cases are referred to the designated ART centre for proper management and follow up. In the last one year, 5711 males and 4789 females attended the centre for HIV testing. For the prevention of parent to child transmission of HIV(PPTCT), all pregnant women visiting the Obstetrics Dept. of AIIMS are offered HIV testing as well as the pretest and post-test counselling in a similar manner. A total of 525 antenatal women were tested during this period. Only one pregnant woman was found to be HIV positive.

Community Services/Outreach Programme:

I. OPPORTUNISTIC HEPATITIS C SCREENING

A free Hepatitis C screening camp was organized in the CFM OPD in collaboration with the Department of Microbiology from 25th August 2018 to 18th September 2018. A total of 1220 clients were opportunistically screened for Hepatitis C, and those found positive were referred to the Gastroenterology Department of AIIMS, Patna for further management.

II. CELEBRATION OF RASHTRIYA POSHAN MAAH (NATIONAL NUTRITION MONTH)

Nutrition Behaviour Change Communication and Anemia Test and Treat Camp were organized in the CFM OPD from 24th September 2018 onwards on the occasion of Rashtriya Poshan Maah (National Nutrition Month) under POSHAN Abhiyan and Anemia Mukht Bharat. In this camp, all children (5-14 years), adults (>15 years) and pregnant as well as lactating women were tested for Hemoglobin levels, and those found anaemic were distributed free IFA and Calcium tablets. They were also counselled regarding appropriate nutrition and dietary modifications for the prevention and treatment of anaemia. So far, around 5400 persons were screened, out of which 61.1% were found to be anaemic.

Infrastructure:

Community Medicine OPD at AIIMS, provides range of services like Yellow Fever / Oral Polio Vaccination is provided for international travellers thrice a week on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday; Tobacco cessation clinic once a week on Thursday; Preventive Cardiology once a week on Saturday; Integrated Counselling and Testing Centre for HIV and Sexually Transmitted Diseases (STD) clinic six days a week.

Rural Health Training Centre (RHTC) at Naubatpur, is an integral part of the Department of Community and Family Medicine (C&FM), AIIMS Patna offers an array of health interventions including preventive, promotive, diagnostic and curative services with counselling to the needy clients. It caters to a variety of

patients who self-report to the centre for utilization of these facilities. It is situated at Naubatpur, within the premises of Community Health Center (CHC) Naubatpur. The spectrum of activities done here are Clinical (General OPD, Ante-Natal Clinic (ANC Clinic), Non-Communicable Diseases Clinic (NCD Clinic) and Immunization Clinic which runs on all the working days of the week), National campaigns like Anemia mukt Bharat Aviyan; Hepatitis-B Screening and of course MBBS Student teaching. The centre also celebrated World TB Day, Poshan Mah, Breastfeeding week and ORS day in the previous year. Last year a Hepatitis C screening camp was organised in the centre. The centre is staffed by one senior resident and 3-4 interns per batch. NCD clinic in the centre mainly caters the cases of hypertension and diabetes. Last year around 200 diabetic and/or hypertensive patient utilised NCD related services from the centre.

Urban Health Training Centre (UHTC) at Khagaul, is about 3.6 km from AIIMS Patna. The PHC is under the administrative control of the Health Department, Government of Bihar. Department has a letter of communication with civil surgeon Patna, Bihar for working arrangement for student's teaching and training. The PHC is situated in ward 27 having a population of 44,364 of which 23,492 are males while 20,872 are females as per report released by Census India 2011. The population of children with age of 0-6 is 5198. Child Sex Ratio in Khagaul is around 843 compared to Bihar state average of 935. Total no of households is 7,951. The spectrum of activities done here are Clinical (General OPD, Non-Communicable Diseases Clinic (NCD Clinic) and Immunization Clinic which runs on all the working days of the week), National campaigns like Anemia mukt Bharat Abhiyan and of course MBBS Student teaching. The centre is staffed by one senior resident, one junior resident and 3-4 interns per batch. The centre also had celebrated World TB Day, Poshan Mah, Breastfeeding week and ORS day in the previous year. Last year a Hepatitis C screening camp was organised in the centre. NCD clinic in the centre mainly caters the cases of hypertension and diabetes. The cases are

screened from general OPD. A registered case in NCD clinic of the centre receives following services: regular monitoring and recording of blood pressure and blood sugar; screening of family members for hypertension and diabetes, counselling of patients and promotion of behavioural changes for lifestyle modification. In immunisation centre, immunization services as per national immunization schedule are provided free of cost to all the pregnant mothers and children. Last year around 2837 patients utilized a range of services offered by the centre.

The future plans of the department include: setting up a well-baby clinic by October 2019, get involved in

immunization activities as per National Immunization Schedule, establish a cohort of at least 500 cases of hypertension and/or diabetes in 1 year, start post-partum counselling and clinical examination, implement standard treatment guidelines in local language to strengthen general OPD services, establish dental services, establish a dynamic digital reporting dashboard for all activities and to obtain a memorandum of understanding with Govt. of Bihar, to attach PHC Khagaul.

DEPARTMENT OF DENTISTRY



Year 2018-19 for the department of dentistry was the period of expansion and growth. With the increase of faculty strength, resident and working area space of the department could diversify specialty dental care services. The plan to start three separate dental operatories were approved by the honorable Director and procurement to establish these facilities were initiated. Also with the grant of one additional OT day and dedicated 10 inpatient beds the department was able to reduce waiting numbers and time for tertiary level surgeries in Oral and Maxillofacial specialty. In academics, inspection for the approval of post graduate course in Oral and Maxillofacial surgery was completed.

The department continued with its research projects and received ethical clearance for new research projects in Oral and Maxillofacial surgery and Public Health Dentistry.

Spectrum of Activities:

- The Department of Dentistry has been providing specialized care to its patients attending the OPD in 5 clinical departments of dentistry (Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery, Prosthodontics, Periodontics, Orthodontics and Public Health dentistry)
- The department has regularly served the community through various diagnostic and treatment camps that were held under the Flagship of AIIMS, Patna and Dental OPD & Treatment Services between 29th Sept 05th Oct 2018 at Life line Express Camp at Arrah in collaboration with Impact India Foundation (IIF), Indian Railways (IR) and attending the Diagnostic camps at Madhuban (East Champaran) Bihar with department of Ophthalmology.
- A series of camps organized between 20/02/2019 to 26/04/2019 Kamaladevi Girls

School & Baliga Boys School, Danapur for Assessing Oral health service utilization patterns among School Children. Other outreach activities included oral health examination for CBI personnel

Teaching & Training:

With the initiation of M.D.S course in the field of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery the department made necessary optimum preparation for the Post Graduate course. The department conducts regular Seminars and JC by Residents every Saturday. The department has also developed proposal for some new innovative approaches in MDS teaching curriculum particularly in Immunology and applied surgical anatomy.

The department has regularly taken classes of Under Graduate (M.B.B.S) students.

DEPARTMENT OF FORENSIC MEDICINE AND TOXICOLOGY (FMT)



Forensic Medicine and Toxicology is that branch of medical science which applies the knowledge of medicine in administration of justice. Injustice causes a great mental, social, spiritual and also physical trauma and this branch participates in prevention and healing of that trauma. Thus we may also say that it is involved in treatment by facilitating administration of justice.

The department of FMT, AIIMS Patna, has been rendering its services since 2013. The department has been proceeding on the path of development with MBBS and PG teaching alongwith training of Faculty, Nursing Officers, SR (s), JR (s) and tutors have taken place and still taking place in the department. Recently, MD (FMT) PG academic course has been started in the department and two Junior Residents (Academic) have joined in January Session.

The department is about to start clinical forensic medicine and post-mortem services and formalities for the same are almost complete. Also, the department envisages to start Toxicological, Forensic Histopathology and DNA laboratory services in near future. We are looking for a state of art Forensic Medicine Department at AIIMS Patna which will pose an example to other national and international institutions.

The Department of General Medicine underwent an expansion with three new Assistant Professors joining in February-March 2018 in addition to one Associate Professor. It runs both outpatient and inpatient services in addition to the undergraduate and postgraduate teaching and continued medical education programme for the faculty and residents.

We continue to see large number of patients in our outpatient clinics. Between 1st April 2018 and 31st March 2019 there were **106104** attendances in the medicine OPD. While a large proportion of these patients consist of the local population of the area, we also see a significant number of patients from other parts of the state, coming for a specialist's opinion. The outpatient clinic runs from Monday to Saturday every week.

The department started inpatient services on 24th March 2014 when we admitted our first patient. Since then, we have been admitting patients regularly. Between 1st April 2018 and 31st March 2019 a total of **1492** patients were admitted to our inpatient services. We have worked closely with our nursing colleagues to put

DEPARTMENT OF GENERAL SURGERY



Introduction:

Department of General Surgery is one of the major departments of the Institute which aims to provide all the medical and surgical care related to the surgical conditions of the patient attending the department through outpatient department and emergency/ accidental problems. Department provide general surgery services related to all types of surgery related to thyroid, breast, abdomen and soft tissues. Minimal access surgery forms the major bulk of the surgery including both basic and advanced surgical procedure. We undertake large number of hernia surgery techniques and have also started research work in the same field. Recently we have done thyroid surgery by minimal access technique which is the first time in this region. Department has started various research projects in collaboration with other department.

Spectrum of Activities:

A.. Clinical Services: At present, Department is providing Outdoor and Indoor facilities to the patients along with all types of Major and Minor, open and laparoscopic surgeries.

Outdoor: Surgery OPD provides services on six days a week. In morning session (9:00AM-01:00PM), Two regular surgical OPD runs to cater the patients and in evening session (2:00PM – 5:00 PM) one regular surgical OPD and one speciality clinic runs. About two hundred patients are advised and treated daily.

The undergraduate students are taught general examination along with investigations, diagnosis and management of common surgical disorders. They are made familiar with prevalence of different disease like appendicitis cholecystitis,

pancreatic and liver diseases. They are also trained to recognise to different type of cancer arising in common organs like thyroid, breast and other parts of the body. The teaching programme includes lectures, seminars, clinical work, field work and tutorials with the following objectives:

- 1. To be able to examine and write case histories of common surgical disorders in the OPD.
- 2. To be able to write histories, do clinical examinations, perform routine investigations, pre and post-operative follow-up during the ward posting and submit detailed case histories.
- 3. To be able to detect common surgical diseases in their early stages.
- 4. To be able to define and illustrate general principles of surgical care.
- 5. To be able to identify surgical emergencies and give first aid as well as choose proper referrals to specialists.
- 6. To be able to perform common day to day investigations like B. P. recording, urinary catheterisation, Ryle's tube insertion, venous cannulation etc.

DEPARTMENT OF MICROBIOLOGY



Introduction

The Department of Microbiology was established in the year 2013. The Department is dedicated to quality educational, research and patient care activities. In 2018, the departmental laboratory was expanded further to the Central laboratory to provide round the clock services for patient care. Besides routine patient care services, there is active participation of the department in hospital Infection Control programme. Post graduate teaching program along with Ph. D. course will be starting at the department in 2019.

Spectrum of Activities

The faculty members and residents train the undergraduate MBBS and B.Sc. Nursing students with the aim to provide an insight about the principles of Medical Microbiology and its application in patient care activities. An

environment of research prevails in the department to inspire students to design their own projects and make significant contribution in research field. Regular guidance is provided to short term trainees to enhance their laboratory skills and generate interest in research activities. The research works carried out in the department have been published in various national and international journals. The Department of Microbiology is also dedicated to patient care in collaboration with different clinical departments by conducting various diagnostic tests and timely reporting of the test results. The department contributes to the infection control activities by conducting microbiological environmental surveillance and providing training to healthcare workers for infection prevention practises on regular basis.

Special test like Gene Expert (CBNAAT) which is a nucleic acid detection test is done in the department at the medical college building. A Total of 1,767 suspected MTB samples were processed and reported during 01/04/18 to 31/03/19. Besides this, the blood cultures are done by using the automated blood culture platform-BACT Alert (Biomereux).

The department of Gastroenterology at All India Institute of Medical Sciences, Patna, was established in February 2018. A single faculty member with the help of three hospital staffs and support from hospital administration made the beginning possible. Since its commencement, the department has made considerable progress in terms of infrastructure, clinical services and staff strength. The department now has two faculty members and seven resident doctors. DEPARTMENT OF MEDICAL ONCOLOGY & HEMATOLOGY

In the year 2018-2019 in Department of Neonatology 292 babies admitted in NICU, 47 babies were preterm. In last 6 Months (October 18 to March 19) 88% Inborn admitted and 12% Outborn admitted through pediatric emergency.

The Department of Neurology was started in August 2016. Within a short span of two years the Department has expanded from running OPD from a single room to a block of its own with services including EEG, Video EEG, Nerve Conduction Studies, EMG and In-patient care. Currently, the services of the Department are well sought-after and popular in the local population and nearby states.

Spectrum of Activities:

Clinical

Currently, the Department in the OPD else one of the busiest in the Institute running beyond the official hours. The patients profile includes cases like headache, Myasthenia gravis, Peripheral Neuropathies, Infectious disorders, Stroke, ataxias, auto-immune encephalitis, demyelinating illnesses and various myopathies. Awareness Programmes: Awareness regarding various neurological disorders is missing in the general population and to fill this void the Department conducted awareness programmes on World Epilepsy day and World Parkinson's day. The patients and their care-givers were invited where various myths were dispelled and queries patiently answered. Booklets regarding the disease and management were also distributed along with special spoons and forks to patients of Parkinson's disease. There is a lot of stigma attached to Epilepsy for which the Department strives to raise awareness about the condition so that the patients are not discriminated at their home and workplace.

The Department has regular bedside teaching and seminars for its residents and technicians

where the residents are encouraged to attend seminars of other relevant departments. The faculty is also involved in teaching MBBS students, the classes of which are allotted according to the roster. Inter-departmental interactions include Neuroradiological meet every Tuesday at 3:30 pm and regular interactions with the department of Neurosurgery.

Department of Ophthalmology, AIIMS Patna came into existence on 18th February 2014. Department was initially being run by Senior Residents providing basic Ophthalmology services with few basic equipments. After Joining of three faculties January 2018, holistic development of department started.

The department has shifted to dedicated OPD wing. OPD runs on all working days. Department also runs special clinic of cornea and ocular surface disorders, Retina, Uvea, Occuloplasty, Squint, Ocular oncology and Glaucoma on different days simultaneously. Department has one dedicated modular OT in New OT complex and 30 bedded dedicated eye ward with modern amenities.

Department got permission to start postgraduate course in Ophthalmology from july 2019 session. Three postgraduate seats have been approved per year.

Department has examined a total of **47756 patients** in outdoor with routine as well as complex ocular problems. A total of **1312 patients** have been admitted in Day Care and IPD during the period of April 2018 and March 2019.**1013** major, **158** minor surgeries and **880** OPD procedure has been done during the period of April 2018 to March 2019.

We serve a large referral base and patients travel long distance to take opinion and benefit from the expertise of our department. We get referral from whole Bihar, adjoining area of Jharkhand, west Bengal, Uttar Pradesh and even Nepal.

- Department has admitted 776 cases between 1st April 2018 to 31st March, 2019 and has operated on 570 Major and 36 minor cases; most of them are advanced surgeries (tertiary level centre cases)
- Department has performed 1586 OPD procedure during 1st April 2018 to 31st March 2019.
- Department of Orthopaedics is doing Joint replacement, Knee and Shoulder arthroscopic and spine surgeries regularly and has surpassed the number done at any Medical College in Bihar.
- Various intramural projects and researches are going on in the department and various

and few have been published too in indexed iournals.

The department participates in various outreach health camps conducted in different parts of the state.

Teaching & Training:

The department is imparting undergraduate and post-graduate education and training.. There are seminars and journal clubs going on for the postgraduates and senior residents in the department.

Infrastructure:

- IPD beds: 30 beds and almost same number of beds in Trauma & Emergency
- OPD: OPD runs six days a week from Monday to Saturday catering to all the orthopaedic problems. Special clinics of hip and knee, spine and paediatric orthopaedics run in the second half of the OPD day.
- O.T.: OT runs 5 days a week from Monday to
- Emergency OT: 24 x 7 x 365 started from 1 st Aug, 2018.
- Specialized services/procedures offered by Dept.: All primary and complex trauma surgeries are being performed along with paediatric CTEV corrections by Ponsetti technique, around 280 cases.
- Special /Advanced surgeries: Hip and Knee arthroplasties, Knee and Shoulder arthroscopies, Spine surgeries (cervical, dorsal and lumbar) are being performed.

DEPARTMENT OF PEDIATRICS



In the year 2018-2019 the Department of Pediatrics consolidated on multiple fronts along with addition of new facets in terms of patient care, education & research. These measures have firmly placed the Department of Pediatrics as a forerunner in terms of pediatric education & research in the region along with fulfilling the Institute's mandate of providing this hitherto deficient region with specialised tertiary pediatric care.

Some of the highlights for the year 2018-19 include:

Beginning of Post-graduation course (MD) from the session January 2019

Consolidation of existing pediatric sub-speciality clinics including dedicated filing & record keeping for all registered patients across all subspeciality clinics.

Introduction of new specialised Pediatrics endocrinology Clinic.

Initiation of baby friendly OPD areas.

Functional organisation of pediatric subspecialties services.

Introduction of emergency services to facilitate 24x7 hours clinical services for the sick and critical patients.

Establishment of new PICU and expansion of services from 6 bedded to 12 bedded.

Parental education and mass awareness initiative in OPD area and indoor areas.

Mass awareness of CPR, Sanjeevani Programme for the health care providers in the hospital.

Revamp of Undergraduate (UG) curriculum to include major national pediatric modules for more problem oriented –resource based pediatric training of MBBS graduates.

Formulation of academic schedule for residents of the Department to promote research interests & evidence based management.

Formalisation of academic schedule of Continuing Nursing Education for staff nurses of the Department along with continuation of Directly Observed Procedural Skills (DOPS) as a learning tool to promote safe healthcare.

Organisation of Pediatric Subspecialty CMEs & workshops with a vision to enhance intramural capabilities.

Publication & initiation of patient oriented, pragmatic research.

Spectrum of Activities

- Located in one of the most underserved areas in terms of health infrastructure, more so in child health; the Department, right from its inception endeavoured to bring evidence based, protocol driven & holistic child health care in the region. The year 2018-19 saw the department firmly establishing itself as a tertiary referral centre for the region. The services provided by the Department Of Pediatrics toward the sick or healthy child are:
- 1. General OPD
- 2. Speciality Clinics
- 3. Indoor Services
- 4. Pediatric Intensive Care Unit
- 5. Neonatal Services
- 6. Pediatric Emergency
- 7. Post natal services
- 8. Pediatric psychology services
- · Counselling programme for parents and attendants by the medical and nursing staff on regular basis

Parental stress management (for admitted patients) by child psychologist every Thursday

- · Landmark **Sanjeevani program** with the aim to impart teach CPR skills to health care providers and lay persons. Coordinated more than 50 programs in east zone of India.
- **Undergraduate Education:** With over 140 hours of didactic teaching, 138 hours of tutorials &1500 hours of clinical postings in last year, the Department of Pediatrics at AIIMS, Patna

provides one of the most comprehensive curriculums for undergraduates. The Department this year redesigned the UG curriculum to inculcate modules like Facility Based Integrated Management of Neonatal & Childhood Illnesses (FIMNCI), Facility Based Neonatal Care (FBNC), Basic life support(BLS), Advanced Life Support (ALS), aimed at producing medical graduates capable of giving a fillip to child health services in the country.

- **Postgraduate Education:** From the session January 2019, the department has started training to two PG trainees per session as approved. As part of ongoing academic training, the Department conducts daily morning academics for Postgraduate trainees, Senior Residents & Faculty which clocked more than 200 hours last year. These academic sessions in the form of as seminars, case discussions, protocol discussions, journal club meetings on intra and inter department platforms; are meant not just to keep abreast with new guidelines & recommendations but also are the stepping stones for creation of evidence based, indigenous protocols suited to the Institute's needs. Awareness for scientific research imparted by these academic sessions have shaped into multiple projects, papers and research letters. These sessions proved to be sound learning platforms for the actualisation ofhigh level of knowledge and skill to all PG trainees.
- Nursing Education: The Department firmly believes in an empowered supporting team of

nursing professionals for complete & safe health care. Regular classes for staff nurses posted at Department are to enhance capabilities in terms of triage, procedures, asepsis routines etc. In addition, the Department has actively participated in conducting didactic weekly lectures in Pediatrics for BSc Nursing students in year 2018-19.

• Innovation in education: The Department endeavours to optimise the training of its workforce has introduced an Objective Structured Clinical Examination (OSCE) and Directly Observed Procedural Skills (DOPS) for routine pediatric procedures. We have also introduced student CMEs, integrated teaching for Undergraduates and microteaching at senior resident level. DOPS has been a proven modality in improving Knowledge, Attitude and Practices (KAP) of units worldwide and therefore beyond being innovation in training, it also reflects the department's commitment for safe and quality healthcare. Microteaching has improved teaching and learning capabilities at senior level also.

Infrastructure:

General OPD:

Foot fall in the general OPD has consistently increased over the period. The fact that we catered the children from UP, Orissa, West Bengal, Jharkhand & even Nepal is testimonial of the increasing prominence of our Institute in regional & national landscape of health care.

Indoor Services:

- 1. Indoor Pediatric General Ward: The volume of admissions increased from 393 in 2014-15 to 1056 in 2017-18. Since April 2018, a total of 1155 patients have been admitted in pediatric ward till March 2019.
- 2. Pediatric Intensive Care Unit: The PICU services expanded from 6 bedded to 12 bedded with shifting of the PICU cubicle to 2nd floor D Block in July 2018to cater increased number of sick and critically ill children. With this expansion, the number of patients admitted in PICU swelled considerably from 328 in the year 2017-18 to 416in the period April 2018 to March 2019.
- 3. Neonatal Services: Strengthening of neonatal services is evolving into Level III NICU capable of providing comprehensive neonatal intensive

- care. A total admission increased from 50 in 2015-16 to 159 in 2017-18. In the period of April 2018 to March 2019, 292 neonates have been admitted.
- 4. Pediatric Emergency: The Department had been providing pediatricemergency services since 2015-16 to to intramural follow-ups in beyond OPD hours. It was a consultant supervised service by the department as a pilot project before formal opening of emergency services. The institutional emergency services started on 21ST August 2018 with the number of patient catered being 1099 till March 2019.

At AIIMS, Patna we are treating a wide spectrum of diseases involving neonatal and pediatric age group affecting different body systems. Our team is dedicated to provide quality services to the patients for betterment of their health conditions. We are imparting the basic knowledge of pediatric surgical conditions at peripheral levels to decrease the suffering of both patients and their parents. We aim to provide our best research work in the field of pediatric surgery at AIIMS, Patna. In this context, we have more than three dozen clinical research publications & three

research work that is going on.

M.Ch. in Pediatric Surgery has been started in the department of Pediatric Surgery. We are also planning to start PDCC in Neonatal Surgery and Pediatric Urology in the near future.

The inborn fetal care, neonatal endoscopic surgery and minimal invasive surgeries of the abdomen & urogenital structures are routinely done. We are adding Thoracoscopy with diagnostic and therapeutic along with neurosurgery in few months.

The department is also generating awareness about surgical conditions of Pediatric Population by different communication channel available.

The Department of Pathology imparts services in the patient care by its different diagnostic facilities along with Teaching of Undergraduate, Postgraduate, Paramedical and Nursing students. The Department actively indulges in Academic and Research activities in keeping with the Aims and Goals of AIIMS Patna.

Spectrum of Activities

The Diagnostic services by Department of Pathology is presently running at three different places with emphasis on strict quality assurance for every sections. These are-

- 1. **Histopathology** in the Administrative / College building
- 2. Central Laboratory services including **Haematology & Cytopathology** in the IPD building, D-Block, Fourth floor of the Hospital
- 3. Clinical Pathology services (Urine, Body fluids and PAP smears) in the ground floor, OPD building. Department of Pathology caters to a large number of samples for Haematological, Cytopathological and Histopathological tests and is dedicated to providing state of the art ancillary services. Specialized patient care facilities available are: Diagnostic full panel IHC markers by fully automated System, Coagulation profile, HPLC, Flow cytometry etc. with the goal to excel in sub-specialties of Histopathology, Cytopathology, Hematopathology and Clinical Pathology.

 The Pathology department also provides 24 hour diagnostic facility for emergency services in central lab.

B.Sc. (Hons.) Nursing

- Mannequin based simulation to reinforce pharmacological concept has been started.

- Basic research related equipment's are under process of purchase along with basic clinical service related equipment.
- Clinical Pharmacology Unit (CPU) will be set up in the upcoming hospital building so that DM clinical Pharmacology may be started.

- Long term (2 to 5 years) training
- Clinical Pharmacology Unit (CPU) will standardize available equipments and processes with ongoing validation to start clinical trails.
- Regular training activities will be conducted for capacity building.
- · High end equipments are under process of procurement for the state-of-the art clinical pharmacology lab and research unit.

Infrastructure:

The department is well equipped with CAL Lab, Therapeutic Drug Monitoring Lab, PG Research lab with Flowcytometer.

Specialized services/procedures offered by Dept.:

- Department is running ADR monitoring centre under Pharmacovigilanceprogramme of India (PvPI). Reporting ADRs due to drugs from OPD & IPD patients is done. And also planning to educate the patients about adverse drug reactions and how to report them for safe use of medicines.
- · In the coming days department is planning on regular basis to conduct a workshop/CME to train and involve faculties, junior doctors, nurses, nursing students and other paramedics in ADR reporting under PvPI to improve the no. & quantity of ADR reporting.
- The department will further set up a Clinical Pharmacology Unit (CPU) in the hospital building to cater patient care services and clinical research activities.
- · Department is in process of developing & providing best possible pharmacotherapeutic support to various departments of the institute, in the form of prescription audit system; e-prescription system to detect drug-drug interactions and adverse drug reactions; geriatric and paediatric Clinical Pharmacology Unit in hospital; pharmacogenomic and toxicology lab for prevention, early detection and management of ADRs; drug testing lab for quality check of medicines.

DEPARTMENT OF PHYSICAL MEDICINE AND REHABILITATION (PMR)



"Physical medicine and rehabilitation" (PM&R), also known as "Physiatry" or "Rehabilitation Medicine", aims to enhance and restore functional ability and quality of life to those with physical impairments or disabilities affecting the brain, spinal cord, nerves, bones, joints, ligaments, muscles, and tendons.

The goals of physiatrist are to maximize patients' independence in activities of daily living and improve quality of life.

Physical Medicine – Word "physical" in Physical Medicine encompasses all three expressions that pertain to our Physical State (body), physical agents (heat, light, sound, cold, etc.) and physical activities/exercises. Hence, Physical Medicine may be described as diagnosis and treatment of neuro-musculo-skeletal disorders with the use of medications, modalities, intervention procedures (including surgical procedures), environmental & lifestyle changes, exercises and education; individualized to the patient's needs. That is why; it is often called "cementing force" between different specialties of modern medicine, having access to all the available modes of treatment.

Rehabilitation - Rehabilitate in Latin (habilitas) means to "make able". In rehabilitation, physiatrists assess the available potential in an individual and improve it to the maximum with different modalities. Where there is permanent or temporary loss in potential they are supplemented with braces, walking aids, splints, artificial limbs, electronic devices etc, in order to gain maximum function.

The department of Physiology at AIIMS Patna is dedicated to state-of-art teaching, research and clinical services and is fairly successful in its endeavour for excellence in the field. In the reference period the department has established its clinical Physiology lab as a part of central lab facility of the Institute. The department has been permitted for 7 PG seats and one post graduate student took admission in the present session.

DEPARTMENT OF PSYCHIATRY



The Department of Psychiatry has a wholesome development in the infrastructure, patient care and research. Ever since its inception, it has grown with leaps and bounds.

The Psychiatry OPD was started on March, 2013 and IPD was started on 3rd September 2018, recently. Now, the Dept. of psychiatry has 3 faculties (1 Associate Prof. and 2 Asst. Prof.), seven senior Residents (SR) and two postgraduate students from July 2019 session. The faculty members have expertise in a variety of field including Adult psychiatry, Geriatric psychiatry, Child and adolescent psychiatry, Addiction Psychiatry, Headache, Epilepsy, Sleep disorders, and Cognitive neurosciences. So, the Dept. is going to be a state of art in treatment, research and training, and patient care. All the faculties are well experienced in teaching and training of UG and PG students. We are getting patients all around Bihar and adjacent states like Jharkhand, Uttar Pradesh, Nepal and West Bengal. We are usually getting a wide range of psychiatric cases including complicated, treatment resistant, and referral cases, for the purpose of diagnostic evaluation and management. The department is regularly taking allotted classes for MBBS and BSc Nursing students, along with the teachings during clinical postings in the OPD.




Clinical Services:

The department has a fully functional clinical psychiatry service facility capable of providing services in general adult psychiatry and various other specialty psychiatry services. In addition, the department is also providing consultation-liaison and emergency psychiatry services. The clinical services are being provided in out-patient with special clinics (Child Guidance clinic, Deaddiction clinic and geriatric clinic). We are giving 24×7 coverage to our patients. Since its inception, the department incurs an OPD attendance of nearly 7600 patients per year, which is expected to increase substantially in future. At present, an average of 50 patients are seen in the psychiatry OPD every day.


Three special clinics currently running are: De-Addiction Clinic, Child Guidance Clinic and Geriatric clinic. Child Guidance Clinics is functioning in collaboration with department of Paediatrics and geriatric Clinic is functioning in liaison with department of Medicine and Neurology. A wide range of seizure disorders are managed in the general OPD in collaboration with department of Neurology. We are going to start a modified ECT soon.

Teaching activities:

The department is regularly taking the allotted classes for MBBS and BSc Nursing students, along with teaching them daily in their clinical postings in the OPD. We have designed a teaching curriculum for the various MBBS semesters in lines of that being followed at AIIMS, New Delhi. This includes integrated seminars along with

other departments, clinical case conferences, tutorials. The department also holds weekly clinical grand rounds along with the PG students and the senior residents. For, newly joined post graduate, we are taking orientation classes daily (5 days a week) till November 2019.

The Department of Pulmonary Medicine, AIIMS, Patna caters to a wide spectrum of diseases of Pulmonary Medicine ranging from airway disorders like chronic obstructive pulmonary disease, bronchial asthma, infections like pneumonias and tuberculosis, pleural disorders, carcinomas of the respiratory tract to occupation-related lung disorders and interstitial lung diseases. The Department has already started Endoscopic services like Video-bronchoscopy, Semi rigid Thoracoscopy and Level I Polysomnography and is soon going to start EBUS & Rigid bronchoscopy. The department is committed to deliver quality clinical services to all the patients suffering from respiratory illness.

Spectrum of Activities

OPD runs on all working days of the week. Total OPD Patients seen in previous year are 1,864 and total IPD Patients are 362. In the educational area, regular teaching of undergraduate is being conducted with 18 didactic Lecture, 12 tutorials and clinical teaching. Departmental seminars are conducted very Friday (28 in a year), Journal clubs on every friday (12), case discussion on

every Wednesday (21).

Infrastructure

General OPD runs on all 6 working days of the week and special clinic includes ILD clinic on every Tuesday from 2pm-5 pm (92 patients have been registered till date), Pulmonary rehabilitation clinic runs every Thursday from 2pm-5pm, Lung cancer clinic - Every Monday from 10pm-2pm. The department has 30 beds in IPD (including One Bronchoscopy Room, One Thoracoscopy Room, One Procedure Room, One Doctor Duty Room & Two Sleep Labs).

The equipments available in the department are Fibreoptic Video Bronchoscope, Fibreoptic Scope, Semi rigid Thoracoscope, Spirometry, Diffusion, USG machine, NIV, Multipara monitor, ABG. The specialized procedures offered by the department includes spirometry (> 5,000), fibre optic Bronchoscopy (approx. 300), diffusion (186), > 250 pleurocentesis, Intercostal tube placement (124), Flexi rigid thoracoscopy (53), Polysomnography (42).

Radiation Oncology facility startedwith installation of state-of-the art High Energy Linear Accelerator – Versa HD, High Dose Rate Brachytherapy unit and CT Simulator after obtaining License from AERB for the same. World class Radiation treatment is available for the masses at affordable cost .The Department is committed to provide world class cancer care to the patient. Its aim is to deliver high quality oncology service in a compassionate and supportive manner. Evidence based oncology is the main focus of clinical practice. The department is motivated for early detection and prevention of cancer. Free cancer screening and awareness camps and rallies are being organised on a regular basis. Emphasis is to offer personalized medicine to the common man with affordable ease. We cater to the needs of Paediatric oncology with an MOU with CANKIDS a charitable national society. Striving hard to foster leadership development in the field of oncology through training programs. We regularly contribute in Quick Medical Response training for nuclear disaster management and Anti-Tobacco campaigns. The Department has obtained approval to start Post graduate teaching in the Department.

Spectrum of Activities:

• Outpatient Consultation and Services:

The outpatient clinic is located in the basement of the OPD Block. Aim is to provide comprehensive quality care to patients and their families. New patients are consulted on Monday, Wednesday and Friday and old patients on all days with facilities of interdepartmental referrals anytime. The department is registered for the Hospital based National Cancer Registry programme under the "National Centre for Disease informatics and Research", Bangalore. Tumour Board for patients are held on Monday, Wednesday and Fridays.

The Department of Transfusion Medicine is committed to provide the highest quality of Transfusion support both in terms of diagnostic and therapeutic modes of treatment round the clock to the patients. Brief outline of the department and its role in the hospital are mentioned as under:

Trauma & Emergency Department is the fifth department of AIIMS- Patna next to Anatomy, Physiology, Bio-Chemistry & Community Medicine and exists in the history of AIIMS Patna since 25th August 2012. Presently, it is being managed by three Associate Professor and two Assistant Professor. Trauma & Emergency Department has 60 beds in Trauma Block and 30 beds in Emergency Block catering General Surgery, General Medicine, Nero Surgery, Orthopaedics Surgery, Plastic Surgery, CTVS Surgery and Paediatrics. The Department was officially inaugurated on 6th August 2018 by Hon'ble State Health Minister Shri Ashwani Chobey Ji.

Presently 4 Major OTs, 1 Minor OT, 1 Plaster Room, 15 bedded ICU and 4 bedded four HDU are functional in T& E Department. Our Patient receiving area is divided in three zones that are Red, Yellow and Green Area. In our Emergency Department, (Red, Yellow and Green area) triage is being done by Trauma nurse co-ordinator. All life threatening and limb threatening injuries are being stabilized by our trauma team on the concept of ATLS Protocol. Training programme like CT (Chattisa & Telemedicine) and SKY (Sharwan Kumar Yojna) course has been established to train the people of Bihar to provide first aid and safe transport of the patients to the Department of Trauma & Emergency.



SCHEDULE: 24 - SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This is the fifth annual account of the Institute since coming into existence in 2009 and period of account is consolidated for the period from 1st of April, 2018 to 31st of March, 2019.

1. The Financial Statement of Institute Accounts

The Financial Statement is prepared in three parts viz. Receipt and Payments account, Income and Expenditure Account and Balance sheet. The Annual Account is prepared on Uniform Format of accounts for Central Autonomous Bodies as applicable for AIIMS, Patna also.

2. Accounting Policies

The standard Accounting Policies has been adopted in preparation of Annual Account of Institute which are stated below:

(i) Account Convention

The accounts have been prepared on historical cost basis, unless otherwise stated and on accrual method of accounting.

(ii) Revenue Recognition

The Institute is funded by the Grant from MOH & FW. In addition, Institute requirement of infrastructures like Furniture and Fixtures, and Equipments made over to Institute have been recognised as Grant in Kind. The institute has also generated internal resources through different laboratory tests, miscellaneous hospital charges recovered from the patient, admission fee, examination fee recovered from the students and cost recovered from sale of tender documents etc, and other income.

(iii) Fixed Assets

Fixed Assets are stated at cost of acquisition inclusive of inward freight, duties, taxes and other incidental and direct expenses incurred in connection with the acquisition of assets. Fixed Assets are capitalised with the value of its acquisition cost.

Assets created out of the Earmarked Funds, where the ownership of such assets vests with the Institute, are shown as Fixed Assets of the Institute.

Equipments procured by HLL life care limited (PSA of MoHFW) of Rs. 23,80,12,645.76 procured against Advance given and Rs. 5,77,82,232.88 directly procured from MoHFW (taken as per list provided by HLL) were capitalize during the year 2018-19 on the basis of Final acceptance certificate.

Fixed Assets have been stated on cost basis acquired by institute, or those provided to Institute by the Ministry through centralized purchasing.

3. Depreciation

Depreciation is provided at the rate prescribed in Income Tax Rules, 1962 at Written Down Value (WDV) method. On additions within 180 days from the starting of financial year under review depreciation is calculate on full rate and after 180 days of additions depreciation is calculate on half rate.

4. Provisions

All Income and Expenditure are maintained on accrual basis. Provisions has been calculated of all known liabilities having amount is known at the date of balance sheet.

5. Accounting Policy adopted for government grant

Grant-in-aid is received from Ministry of Health and Family Welfare Govt. of India (PMSSY.Scheme).

Grant/Subsidies includes Grant-in-aid (General head), Grant-in-aid (Salary head) and Grant-in-aid (Creation of Capital Assets).

Grants from the Central Government are accounted for on realization basis for the financial year 2018-19

Unspent Grants have been transferred to Reserves & Surplus Account and shown as unspend grant at the end of financial year 2018-19.

Grants related to depreciable fixed assets has been treated as deferred income which is recognized in the income and expenditure statement on a systematic and rotational basis over the useful life of the assets i.e. such grant is recognized to income over the periods and in the proportion in which depreciation on those assets is charged. The deferred income balance is separately disclosed in account in schedule 2 under the head capital reserve attached with balance sheet.

Grants related to revenue is recognized in the Income and Expenditure statement in schedule 13 attached with balance sheet.

6. Foreign Currency Transaction

Transaction denominated in foreign currency are accounted at the exchange rate prevailing at the date of transaction.

GPF/VPF Employer Contribution Rs. 79,710/- has been deducted because it had mistakenly been treated as liability, Provision for depreciation Rs. 3,85,53,442/- has been added due to deduction of fixed assets as per list provided by HLL and consequent deduction of provision of depreciation earlier charged, Antivirus software Rs. 1,51,581/- has been added because it had been totally treated as revenue expenditure however the validity of the antivirus was for three years hence adjusted and Telephone & Communication Rs. 5,96,269/- has been added because it had mistakenly been treated as revenue expenditure during financial year 2017-18 however the expenditure is related to financial year 2018-19 hence it was prepaid expenditure for financial year 2017-18.

5. Imprest Account

The Institute has maintained the different advances given to 53 departments in imprest Accounts which is part of subsidiary account of main cash transactions which is maintained in digital form in Tally ERP 9.

6. Current Assets, Loans and Advances

The current assets, loans and advances have a value on realisation in the ordinary course of business equal to the aggregate amount shown in the Balance Sheet.

Total Advance given to HLL Lifecare Ltd. (PSA of MoHFW) for supply of various medical equipments till 31st day of March, 2019 is Rs. 116,03,90,428.73 out of which Rs.17,67,76,593.34/- remain unadjusted as on 31/03/2019.

7. Taxation

The Institute is exempt u/s 10(23C)(iiiac) of the Income Tax Act,1961. Therefore, no provision for taxation is required.

- 8. Loans, Advances & Other Assets
 - 8.1 Advances are given to faculty members against travelling allowance .
 - 8.2 "Income accrued" includes interest income accrued on Fixed Deposit Receipts made with Bank of India, Phulwari Sharif, Patna.
- The value of building has been accounted for in books of accounts of the Institute for which the payments has been made by MoHFW directly and as per MoHFW direction, part payment for construction of building made by the Institute, which has been shown as Capital Work-in-Progress.
- Previous year's figures have been re-grouped and re-arranged wherever considered necessary to make them comparable with the current year's figure.

Separate Audit Report of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India on the Accounts of All India Institute of Medical Sciences, Patna for the year ended 31 March 2019.

We have audited the attached Balance Sheet of All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS), Patna as at 31 March 2019, the Income and Expenditure Account and Receipts and Payments Account for the year ended on that date under Section 19 (2) of the Comptroller and Auditor General's (Duties, Powers & Conditions of Service) Act, 1971 read with Section 18 (2) of the AIIMS Act, 1956 as amended. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Institute management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

- 2. This Separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India (C&AG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification, conformity with the best accounting practices, accounting standards and disclosure norms, etc. Audit observations on financial transactions with regard to compliance with the Law, Rules & Regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency-cumperformance aspects, etc., if any are reported through Inspection Reports/C&AGs Reports separately.
- 3. We have conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidences supporting the amounts and disclosure in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by the management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.
- Based on our audit, we report that:
- We have obtained all the information and explanations, which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit;

- ii. The Balance Sheet, Income and Expenditure Account and Receipts and Payments Account dealt with by this report have been drawn up in the Uniform format of Accounts prescribed by the Government of India, Ministry of Finance.
- iii. In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by the AIIMS Patna as required under AIIMS Act, 1956 and AIIMS (Amendment) Act, 2012 as it appears from our examination of such books.
- IV. We further report that:-

A. Balance Sheet

A.1.1 Fixed Assets (Schedule 8) ₹ 748.86 crore

The Institute purchased books amounting to ₹ 9150263.00 during 2018-19, but the payment has not been made. However, no provision has been made in the annual account for the period 2018-19. This resulted in understatement of fixed assets (schedule-8) and current liability and provision (schedule-7) by ₹ 9150263.00.

A.1.2 Capital Work in Progress

The Institute has received various instruments worth ₹28.06 crore during the year 2018-19. However, these instruments could not be put to use during the year 2018-19 but the AIIMS, Patna has shown these assets under tangible assets instead of capital work in progress and charged depreciation of ₹3.42 crore on the assets.

This resulted in understatement of capital work in progress under Fixed Assets by ₹28.06 crore and overstatement of depreciation as well as excess expenditure over Income and Expenditure ₹3.42 crore.

A.1.3 The Institute received Neuro Surgery Hand Instruments worth ₹6281736.86 during the year 2018-19 and these instruments were put to use on 04.02.2019. However, depreciation has been charged ₹942261.00 for the complete year instead of ₹471130.00 for 180 days.

This resulted in understatement of Fixed Assets and overstatement of depreciation by ₹471131.00.

A.1.4 The Institute has made payment of ₹7.44 crore towards Arbitration Award in respect of work of Medical College& Hospital complex (Package-1) and exhibited the said payment under Other Administrative Expenses (Schedule-21) instead of Fixed Assets (Medical College & Hospital complex).

This resulted in understatement of Fixed Assets (Schedule-8) by ₹7.44 crore and overstatement of Other Administrative Expenses (Schedule-21) to that extent.

B. Receipt & Payment Accounts

B.1.1 As per Notes of Account (Schedule-25) the Receipt and Payment Account carries the figure of actual receipt and actual payment of the Institute during the financial year 2018-19.

However, the Institute has included the provisions made under Schedule-7 amounting to ₹5.25 crore under indirect expenses and exhibited in Receipt and Payment Accounts. This resulted in overstatement of Receipt and Payment accounts by ₹5.25 crore.

B.1.2 The Institute has earned interest on Debtors and other receivables amounting to ₹10,200.00 and exhibited under Schedule-17. The amount required to be shown under Receipt and Payment accounts but AHMS has not included the said amount in Receipt and Payment Account. This resulted in understatement of Receipt and Payment Account by ₹10200.00

C. General

C.1.1 Non- provision for leave encashment payable on actuarial valuation

Institute has neither disclosed the accounting policy for retirement benefits nor made any provision for the same in contravention of the Accounting Standard 15 issued by ICAI.

C.1.2 The AlIMS, Patna received 101.98 acres of land in the token amount ₹1 in the year 2006 from the Government of Bihar. However, AlIMS, Patna has not exhibited the said land with token money under Schedule-8.

D. Grants-in-Aid

The AIIMS Patna received grants-in-aid of ₹205.99 crore from the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare during the year 2018-19. It had an opening balance of ₹83.82 crore and received bank interest ₹5.67 crore. Out of total amount of ₹295.48 crore, the institute utilized ₹293.62 crore leaving a balance of ₹1.86 crore.

- v. Subject to our observations in the preceding paragraphs, we report that the Balance Sheet and Income and Expenditure & Account/Receipt & Payment Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with the books of accounts.
- vi. In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the said financial statements read together with the Accounting Policies and Notes on Accounts, and subject to the significant matters stated above and other matters mentioned in Annexure to this Audit Report give a true and fair view in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in India.
- In so far as it relates to the Balance Sheet, of the state of affairs of the AIIMS,
 Patna as at 31 March 2019; and
- b. In so far as it relates to Income & Expenditure Account, of the deficit for the year ended on that date.


